




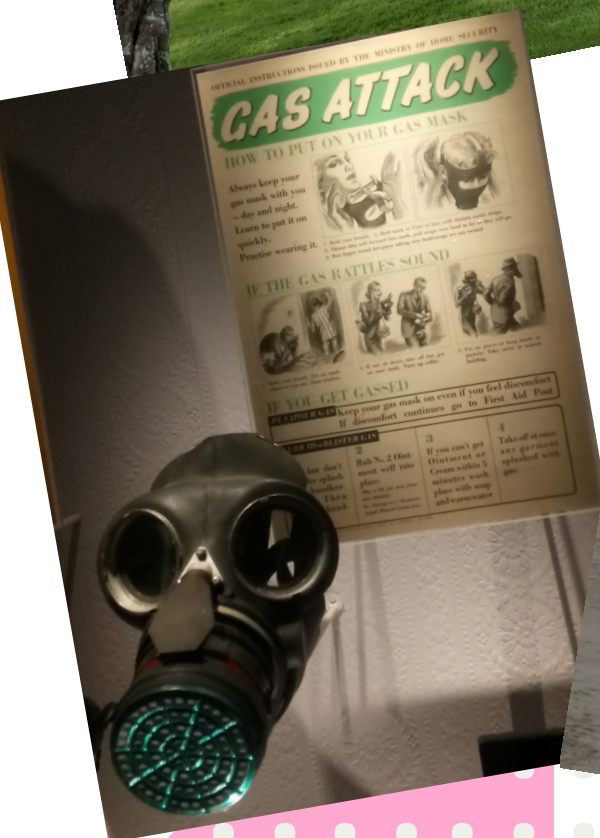
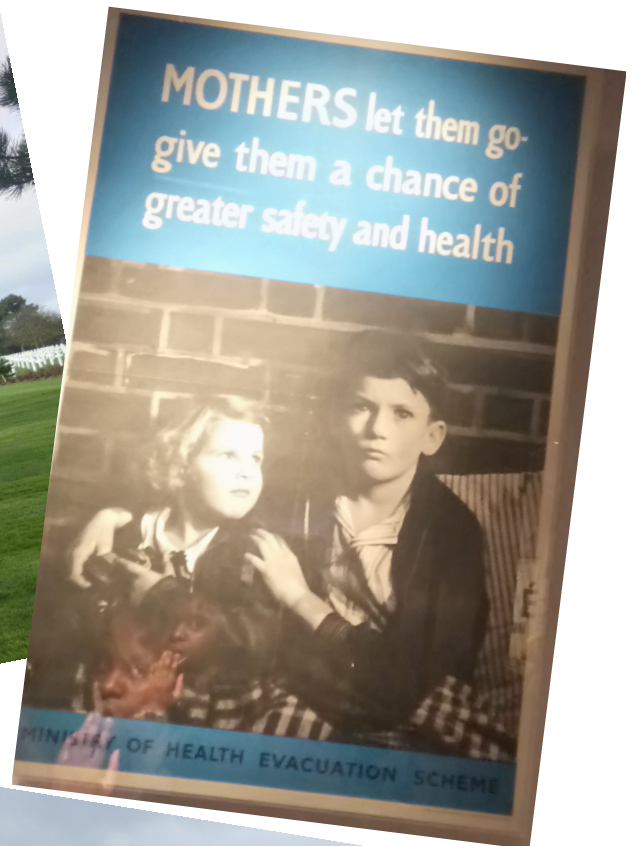

What was the Blitz?

The Blitz was total, no-rules war. It was a new military tactic invented by Germany under Adolf Hitler in 1940: the massive bombardment of British cities at night by the Luftwaffe, the German air force.

The plan was to destroy Britain's infrastructure and break the nation's morale before an invasion from France.

But the invasion never happened. Why? Well, that's the story of the Blitz...



Each child had just one bag and a label around their neck with their name and address.



As soon as war was declared, the British government evacuated all the children from dangerous areas. Almost immediately, three and a half million children from the cities were transported to villages, where it was safe.

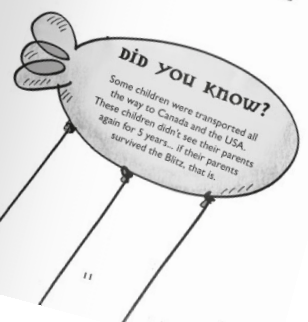


The children didn't know where they were going. Often, in the chaos of the evacuation, even the adults in charge knew! They took the first train out of London!

When the children arrived in a village, the local families chose which child they wanted. Most children stayed with nice families, but some families were horrible and made them work like slaves.



So why were there still so many children in the cities during the Blitz? Firstly, because some parents refused to let their children be evacuated. Secondly, it was some months before the bombing started and many evacuated children were so unhappy that they returned home...
