Hello everybody, So finally the list is complete. There are 14 countries and 15 schools(two schools from the Czech Republic). We should start working with our students now, or let them do the work :-). Below you can read what the project is about and I think now it is just too late to change anything. 1. The idea of the project is to let our students see that there are different languages around the world and also to let them realise that they can already communicate in the foreign language. This will be achieved by exchanging letters.

2. ask your SS to write a letter to a foreign friend beginning *Dear friend* and then writing a few words about themselves, their family, town or country. Topics like hobbies, sports, pets, music etc, anything that interests them

3. at the bottom of the letter they should write **HAPPY EUROPEAN DAY OF LANGUAGES 2014** in any language they know/learn.

4. If they want to get a reply, they can give their email address- which may start some exchange of emails.

5. Attach a postcard from your town/ city and put everything in an envelope.

6. Make sure that you send at least one letter to **EACH** and **EVERY** participating school. Obviously, you can put more letters in one envelope.

7. as the letters arrive it will be a good idea to make a wall display, but it's up to you.

8. we should send the letters around the 20th of September to make sure they arrive on time.

9. Somebody on FB suggested drawing postcards, which may also be a great idea; or a photo- some kind of visual support.

I really hope this will all work out fine, just as it did last year. I remember my students were very excited when the cards started arriving. I really count on you, and please don't leave out any school. If you have any problems, or other ideas please do contact me, Regards , lots of love Joanna
