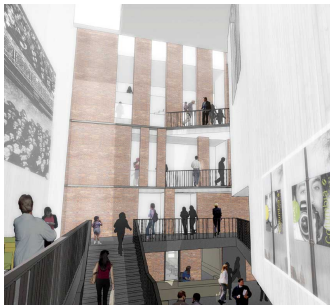


Metropolitan Arts Center (MAC)
