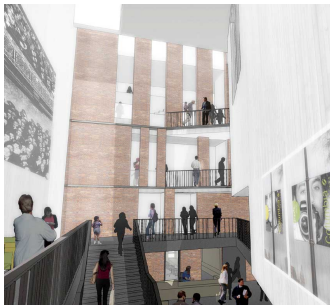


Metropolitan Arts Centre (MAC)
