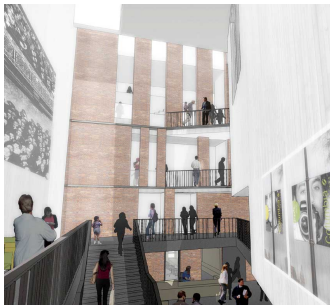


Metropolitan Arts Centre (MAC)

Stormont Parliament Buildings
