
Victoria Square

St Anne's Cathedral



St Anne's Cathedral, also known as Belfast Cathedral, is the focal point of the Cathedral Quarter in Belfast. Built in 1899 by architect Sit Thomas Drew, this magnificent edifice was completed in 1904. It is a beautiful place to visit, in which you can admire two memorials – Edward Carson's and a military one. Moreover, you will not help but gazing at its big colourful stained-glass windows as well as the many historical artefacts

Titanic Museum

Stormont Parliament Buildings
