
Sights of

fairytale setting, stunning views & gardens. The perfect backdrop for weddings, conferences & social events.
4): a ten-metre long ceramic-tiled fish
created by John Kindness, located on Donegall Quay, echoing different aspects of the history of Belfast.
5): the 2016 winner of World's Leading
Visitor Attraction which tells you all about the most famous ship's sinking.
6): one of Belfast's oldest attractions and
recognized as one of the best markets in the UK, awarded for its fresh, local produce and great atmosphere.
7): Belfast's home of international art
exhibitions, best live theatre, top shows and events, located in Cathedral quarter.
8): a boat used as a vibrant interactive
museum which tells the story of Belfast's proud maritime history.
9): a public park gathering greenhouses,
rose gardens, exotic tree displays & impressive plant collections from the Southern hemisphere.
10): Belfast's largest shopping centre,
topped by an iconic dome. It is home to House of Fraser, luxury brands, restaurants and a cinema.
11): the iconic civic building in Belfast,
located in Donegall Square. A 'Titanic Memorial' is to be found in one of its gardens.
12): a popular venue located near the river
Lagan in South Belfast, which offers daffodil gardens, wildflower meadows and mountain bike trails.
13): a tourist venue where visitors enjoy
discovering various wild animal species coming from different parts of the globe.
14): a prestigious theatre in Belfast where
people can enjoy high-quality stage performances – dance, singing, drama.
15): a former detention centre from the
Victorian period (19 th century) which was turned into a museum where you can learn about the living conditions of the prisoners.
