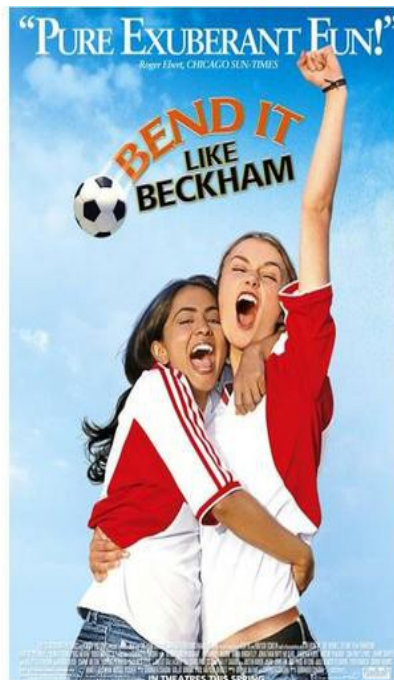
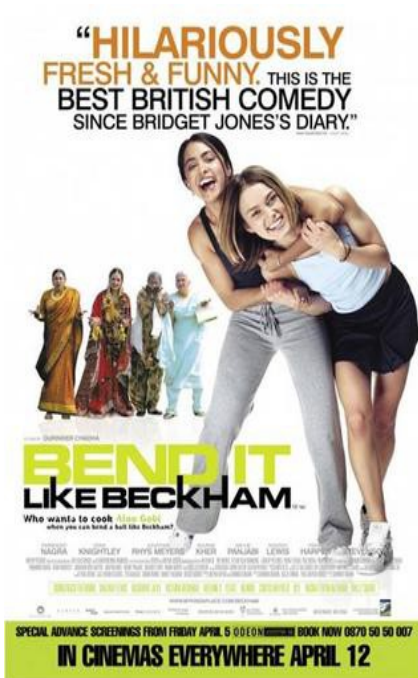
It's official. Nadiya Hussain has been crowned as our Great British Bake Off (*I*) queen.
