Doc 1 : Nadiya. (a contest : un concours / a contestant : un concurrent)

What is the name of the TV programme ?: The Great British Bake Off

Explain in your own words what this programme consists in: The programme is a baking contest.

The contestants are eliminated by a jury one by one and in the end there is only one winner.

Mention a French equivalent programme: Top chef, etc...

Find the word showing that Nadiya is a Muslim: headscarf (voile)

what was the result of the contest ?: Nadiya was the winner

Right or wrong. Justify by quoting frm the short text.

R W After Nadiya's victory everybody cheered and were happy.

Wrong. « waves of loyal fans » (l.8) \underline{BUT} « members of our society who wanted to turn up the temperature on $\underline{prejudices}$ » ($\underline{prejuges}$) (l.9-10)

R W Flora Shedden is a journalist. Wrong. She was another contestant. She was the runner up (finaliste) in the contest.

Who is the journalist ?: Amanda Platell

What is her position concerning Nadiya's victory?: Amanda suggested that Nadiya won not because she was the best but because she is a Muslim. (to please minorities)

What is the image of multiculturalism given by this incident ?: the image is negative. Some people still judge others according to (selon) their origins, culture or religion.

Document 2 : Bend it like Beckham. (movie posters / to score : marquer un but / football boots). Describe the posters.

Poster n°1 is based on two different contrasts. Identify them: Jess' family in the background are dressed in traditional Indian clothes (symbolize tradition) Jess, in the foreground wears the same clothes as any British girl of her age (symbolizes modernity) – Jess' family stick to their culture (they disapprove of a girl playing football) Jess feels she is a full member of the British society (un membre à part entière)

Poster n°2: describe the girls' attitude. Try to find a reason explaining their attitude:

The two girls are wearing <u>football jerseys</u> (maillots). They are <u>hugging</u> each other (être enlacé). Jess' friend is <u>raising her fist</u> (lever le poing) in a sign of victory. They are <u>brimming</u> with joy (déborder) as if they had scored a goal. Symbol: people from different cultures and origins can work together and be successful.

Describe Poster n°3 and interpret it: Jess is wearing Indian traditional clothes (a sari) and hidding football boots behind her back. Symbol: she belongs to (appartenir à) two different cultures but she can't show it openly (ouvertement). She still feels the weight of (le poids) of her family's Indian culture.

Jess has to face two different problems. Identify them.

- a) A gender problem: she is a girl and she wants to succeed in a male sport.
- b) A cultural problem : she has to <u>overcome</u> (surmonter) her parents' <u>prejudices</u> to <u>reach her</u> <u>goal</u> (atteindre son but).
