Linda **has got** a **son**. His name is Jonathan. Linda is Jonathan's **mother**.

Jonathan **has got** a **wife**. Her name is Mavis. Jonathan is Mavis's **husband**.

HAVE GOT = HAVE

Forme affirmative au présent :

I have got
You have got
He, she, it has got
We have got
You have got
They have got


Forme négative :





