

## Remembrance Day - Poppy Day 22

The second Sunday of November is Remembrance Sunday, but what does it mean and what are you supposed to do?

At 11am men, women and children all across Britain hold a two minute silence to remember the millions who have died in war.

What is Armistice Day? Armistice Day is on 11 November. It's also named Remembrance Day. A two minute silence is observed at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month because this is when World War I, or the Great War, ended in 1918.

The week before 11 November, you'll see people on the TV and in the streets wearing a poppy. But what are they for? Poppies are red flowers worn on jackets or shirts to show others that you are remembering those who died for their country. Poppies are used because they are the flowers which grew on the battlefields after World War I ended. Poppies are also used to raise money for soldiers whose lives have been changed by war. The charity that runs the Poppy Appeal is called The Royal British Legion.
